MARGATE TRIP 2023

BTC MEMBER JENNIFER TELLS US ABOUT HER EXPERIENCE

Margate's not all sand and neon arcades, there are other things to do at the popular seaside resort. I went to the Turner Contemporary Gallery. It's been open since 2011 and is a short walk from the main beach. It's a light, airy building and was a cooling place to go to outside of the heat and noise of the beach. Part of the reason for placing the museum in this part of the harbour, is because of Turner's love of the sun's light in the area.





When we went, the Brazilian artist Beatriz Milhazes was in residence. She's a well-known,international, abstract artist. She is known for creating very large abstract canvases, often working with many translucent layers in one canvas. Her work takes on popular culture as well as commentary on the environment. Speaking of the environment, the one downside of my experience was the terrible smells along the coast as result of raw sewage being dumped into the ocean by water companies. BROCKLEY TENANTS AWAY DAY 23RD SEPTEMBER







PLANNING FOR SUCCESS WITH RAJ KUMAR & WIILIAM ROIG

BTC Away Day at the Clarendon Hotel - member Alice describes it:

14 Brockley Tenants members and 4 staff met at the Clarendon hotel Blackheath on Saturday 23rd for a planning programme led by Raj and William of One Enterprise LTD.

The venue is a historic building and unfortunately, despite reassurances from the hotel management, one member was unable to access the meeting room due to mobility issues. This was disappointing but the rest of us formed into work groups and started the day's events.

We began by introducing ourselves to someone we had never spoken to before. With the ice broken, Raj recapped some issues from the previous sessions in 2016 and 2021. He then set us a thought sharing exercise:

What could sink the ship?

In our groups and collectively we discussed what could cause the Co-op to end. Issues such as bad management, corruption, poor financial decisions and staff retention were all explored as well as unexpected national or international crisis. What stood out was the importance of strong management from our committees and the need for succession from the tenant members onto those committees.


Difficult Decisions

Our next scenarios included how to decide how much to increase rents by, assuming our groups were a fictional co op. We had to agree on a 4% or 7% increase.



Every group was divided between the need to provide affordable rents during this cost of living crisis and the need to maintain capital for the future. This reflected real decisions made by our management comittee recently. We kept coming back to the point that we are a business but we are also a co operative and we care about our members welfare.

We also discussed the issue of reporting domestic violence and whose responsibility that is. This led to discussions on the need to support our staff who have to deal with very many issues, including members with mental health issues, on a daily basis. Could members with experience prove some expert advice in these fields?

WHAT IS A CO-OP?



The afternoon focused on the co-op's vision for the future, bearing in mind past successes and mistakes.

Past, present and future aspirations

After introducing ourselves to new group members, we created an image and a few words desccribing how we see BTC in the present. . My group imagined the co-op as a tree providing shelter, knowledge, security and opportunity among many other things. Another group made images of balloons, the past gone, the present still afloat and the future looking hopeful. Other members saw the co-op's journey as a river building in strength and knowledge.

A key issue which returned to the conversation. was whether members our understand and reflect the co-ops principles and values. Do people understand the democratic process? Should new prospective members be asked to undergo an interview to see if they are a good fit for the co-op? Should we be clearer about what is expected from our membership?

Collective Responsibility

We finished by each making a pledge about what we can do individually to support our coop's mission. Raj and William encouraged us to celebrate the fact that our co-op is still afloat after 50 years. Many other enterprises have not made it. It's time to celebrate and also to think about reinvigeration, action planning and positive enforcement. Our members are our strength, combining much talent so and knowledge. Ideas included: a skills register, a befriending service, mental health advice, a rules review and a look at how to recruit the 'right fit' members and staff.

It was a positive day, thought provoking, affirming and fun. A great way to reconnect.

Why should you do the training?

Developing your professional online presence has never been so important as it is today. Prospective employers consistently view candidates' profiles to get additional insights into their capabilities and credibility.

This training will introduce you to the professional online channel, LinkedIn as a means to create, maintain and develop your professional online presence. LinkedIn is increasingly becoming the go-to for people seeking to build their career prospects. No matter your ability or the stage of your career, whether you are a student, working in the creative arts, are an entrepreneur, unemployed or in-between jobs, no matter your age, if you've not had a professional online profile, this will be suitable for you.

Suitable for:

Students, returners to work, people changing careers, unemployed, career-builders, inbetween-jobbers, volunteers, building skills, any age, any career sector.

Prior abilities:

Attendees should have an email account, have at least a Level 1 command of English, some (Level 1) computer literacy.

Duration:

Approximately four weeks at one hour per week, times/dates to be negotiated, though it will be held within BTC office hours.

<u>Training content:</u>

- 1) Intro to social/professional media/Mapping your skills. 2) Creating a LinkedIn profile.
- 3) Maximising a LinkedIn profile. 4) Planning & scheduling posts, comments and images for content on LinkedIn.

What should you bring?

If you have one, your existing CV, but if you don't, you can still build one using skills etc; if you have one, your laptop, however this is not strictly necessary, but it will limit the number of attendees if you don't.

November 2023 or sooner, depending on numbers.

DELICIOUS RED PEPPER SOUP



BTC member Sarah has shared this warming recipe, perfect for an autumn day







Ingredients:

- 4 long red peppers
- 1 medium/large onion
- 2 cloves of garlic
- 2 tsp olive oil
- 350g passata
- 600ml vegetable stock
- 2 tsp smoked paprika

Notes:

- Using bell peppers is also possible, but they are quite wet and dont cook so well at stage 2. Long red peppers are available at Lewisham Market, costing 1.50 for 5.
- The stock does not need to be ready made. A litre of water and a stock cube is fine.
- The chilli powder can be left out or increased as you wish.

Method:

- 1. Cut up the peppers and onion into fairly small pieces and the garlic into very small pieces.
- 2. Heat the olive oil in a large pan and cook the onions and peppers for about 5 mins, stirring frequently.
- 3. Add the garlic and cook for a further few minutes.
- 4. Add the smoked paprika and chilli powder and stir for a few seconds to coat the veg.
- 5. Add the passata and stock and bring to the boil, then simmer for 20 mins
- 6. Blend the soup with a stick blender until only a few bits of whole veg remain


