Rent Matters – Important Information

Please ensure you do not miss out on money you are entitled to by not informing housing benefit or universal credit about the rent rise in July as they will not backdate payments unless there are exceptional circumstances, and this means you will need to make up the difference where claims are not backdated.

Court Costs for Hexagon managed properties

If you are a tenant in a Hexagon owned property we are not able to take Court Action without a legal representative and this means that if we are forced to take legal action to get regular payments of rent where arrears are not decreasing or you are not sticking to agreements made with us the costs, that are generally awarded against you, will be quite high as they will include lawyers fees as well as court fees. For Brockley owned properties we are able to take cases to court directly ourselves and this limits the costs awarded against you to court fees only (currently court fees are £391).

Contents Insurance

Make sure you have contents insurance; many people think they don't really need this but its important to have contents insurance. BTC and Hexagon are not responsible for the contents of your home, so if you are unlucky enough to have an event like a burglary, fire or flood, you would be responsible for replacing any stolen or damaged possessions yourself. Contents Insurance can help cover the costs of this should the worst happen. The National Federation of Housing has linked with insurance companies to produce an affordable policy tailored for social housing tenants. Contact us for more details.

Healthy Start

If you receive benefits you may be eligible for cash support to buy milk and healthy food for your young children. Healthy start is worth up to £280 a year per child. Under the fire safety regulations, we need to ensure that all communal areas are kept clean and clear of your personal possessions. We carry out quarterly checks to try to ensure that this is the case. Hexagon also carry out inspections and can serve us with a breach of our management agreement if they find possessions are being stored in the communal area. Since Grenfell law. Don't store anything outside your flat.



Following the Grenfell Fire the Social Housing Act 2023 came into force to address some of the issues identified by the enquiry. This imposed several new requirements on providers of social housing. One of these requirements is that landlords need to collect information about our residents on a regular basis, there are several reasons for this. One reason concerned safety as during the Grenfell fire the landlord was not able to give accurate information to the emergency services about who was in the building and this added to the problems in rescuing the residents from the fire. Another reason is that landlords need to know Equalities information about residents to ensure they were able to offer services that are relevant to their residents and that their residents reflect the make-up of the community they live in.
