To enable members to get to know other members in their street, we're running a competition to design a sticker. We need something which members who want to can display in their window to show discreetly that BTC members live there.






stickers should be circles or squares

Quick cheesy biscuits

100g plain flour (may be brown)

100g soft butter or spread

80g grated cheese – at least half parmesan

1/2 tsp mustard powder (optional)

Put the ingredients into a blender and blend until everything sticks together in a sort of dough.


Roll this into a cylinder about 4cm across, with your hands, and put in the fridge in a bag for 30 minutes.

Slice into rounds about 5mm thick and bake at 190°C (gas mark 5). You may need two batches.

These do not keep very well, but tend to get eaten quickly!
